AN ORDINANCE RESCINDING ORDINANCES 3-8-2001-1 AND 9-1972 AND ESTABLISHING UPDATED RESTRICTIONS FOR PET CONTROL

WHEREAS, the Village of Thurston wishes to establish updated procedures for pet control; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 3-8-2001-1 and Ordinance 9-1972 need replaced in order to allow for these updated controls;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF THURSTON, FAIRFIELD COUNTY, OHIO, A MAJORITY OF ITS MEMBERS CONCURRING:

SECTION 1: No person shall keep or harbor any dog, cat or any other pet within the Village which, by frequent or habitual barking, howling or yelping, and/or making of any other unreasonably loud and disturbing noises, creates unreasonably loud and disturbing noises of such a character, intensity and duration as to disturb the peace, quiet and good order of the Village. Any person who shall allow any dog, cat or pet to remain, be lodged or fed within, any dwelling, building, yard or enclosure, which he occupies or owns, shall be considered as harboring such dog.

SECTION 2: No dog is permitted to run free off the owner's property. All dogs are re required to be leashed at all times. When a dog is being walked on any city sidewalk, city street or public right-of-way, it has to be on a leash at all times. Dogs must be wearing a county-issued license. A dog can be loose on the owner's property if within a fenced enclosure or tied. It is not permitted to just open the door to allow the dog to "do their business" and then wander about the neighborhood.

SECTION 3: All dog owners who walk their dog must carry something to pick up and properly dispose of the waste. Pet owners must also clean up animal feces on their own property and properly dispose of it.

SECTION 4: Whoever violates any section of this ordinance is guilty of a minor misdemeanor on the first offense. All subsequent violations of this section shall be a fourth degree misdemeanor.

SECTION 5: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that any and all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.


