Ordinance No. 2021-6 Passed March 10, 2021

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4 OF ORDINANCE 2019-3 AND THEREBY ADDING A RATE FOR BULK WATER SALES

WHEREAS, with Ordinance 9-24-89, Council for the Village of Thurston established regulations governing residential water customers and their accounts; and

WHEREAS, over the past thirty-two years, Council for the Village of Thurston has amended Section 1(A)(Metered Rates), Section 1(B)(Minimum Charges/Minimum Schedule of Rates), and Section 1(F)(Temporary Users), *see* Ordinances 12-20-90, 2005-11, 2007-23, 2010-22, and 2019-3; and

WHEREAS, Council for the Village of Thurston would like to add a bulk water rate to its current rate schedule. In order to do so, it must amend Section 4 of Ordinance 2019-3 and thereby amend Section 1(F) of Ordinance 9-24-89; and

WHEREAS, the ordinance will need to be passed on an emergency basis in order to allow for the purchase of bulk water by customers immediately so that the Village can increase revenue in its water fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, **BE IT ORDAINED** BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF THURSTON, FAIRFIELD COUNTY, OHIO, THREE FOURTH'S (3/4'S) OF ITS MEMBERS CONCURRING:

SECTION 1: Section 4 of Ordinance 2019-3, adopted on March 13, 2019 (which actually amends Section 1(F) of Ordinance 9-24-89) shall be amended to read as follows:

- F. Temporary Users/Bulk Sales. Water may be purchased on a temporary basis through a bulk water sale. All sales of bulk water shall be at the rate of \$14.00 per 1,000 gallons. All bulk water sales will be metered and made at the following location: Fire Hydrant at the alley behind 2322 Main St. near 8036 Oak St. Customers must provide their own means and manner to haul the bulk water.

An important thing to remember is that a gallon of water weighs approximately 8.30 lbs. This means 500 gallons of water weighs 4,150 lbs., or more than two tons. Please remember to consider the weight of the water you will be hauling.

SECTION 2: All other sections and sub-sections of Ordinance 2019-3 shall remain unchanged, in effect, and enforceable.

SECTION 3: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of Council and that all deliberations of the Council and any of the decision making bodies of the Village of Thurston which resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 4: All prior legislation, or any parts thereof, which is/are inconsistent with this Ordinance is/are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereof.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law.




