Ordinance No. 2022-11 Passed May 11, 2022

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS H (TEMPORARY USERS/BULK SALES), OF ORDINANCE 2021-18, RESCINDING ORDINANCE 2022-8 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, with Ordinance 2021-18, Council for the Village of Thurston established regulations governing residential water customers and their accounts; and

WHEREAS, Council for the Village of Thurston has been reviewing the Village's water regulations, including the rates being charged and has determined they wish to change the Temporary User/Bulk Water rates based on actual water production costs and in order to stay competitive in the vicinity, and setting up a two-tiered pricing model;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF THURSTON, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1: Section 1(H) of Ordinance 2021-18 shall be amended to read as follows:

H. Temporary Users/Bulk Sales: Water may be purchased on a temporary basis through a bulk water sale. All sales of bulk water shall be at the tiered rates outlined below. All bulk water sales will be metered and made at the following hydrant locations:

- ❖ In the alley behind 2322 Main Street near 8036 Oak Street
- ❖ 2215 Main Street
- ❖ 8061 Broad Street

Low-Consumption Tier – Less than 20,000 gallons per month shall be at the rate of \$14.00 per 1,000 gallons.

High-Consumption Tier – 20,000 gallons per month or more shall be at the rate of \$10.00 per 1,000 gallons.

For both tiers, the \$15 debt-service fee will be assessed monthly per account.

The number of meters, which are supplied by the Village on a monthly basis, will be limited at the sole discretion of the Village. The Village, at its sole discretion, can ask a meter holder to return a meter. Customers must return a meter immediately upon request.

SECTION 2: All other sections and sub-sections of Ordinance 2021-18 shall remain unchanged, in effect, and enforceable.


SECTION 3: Ordinance 2022-8 shall now be rescinded.


