## AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE SALARY OF SCOTT OLIVER AS WATER SYSTEM OPERATOR AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, there currently exists a vacancy in the position of Water System Operator; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor for the Village of Thurston hired Scott Oliver to serve as the Water System Operator, and Scott Oliver has accepted this position as Water System Operator; and

WHEREAS, Council for the Village of Thurston now wants to approve the updated pay rate for this position.

WHEREAS, Council wishes to pass the ordinance on an emergency basis in order to pay the Water System Operator immediately for his services;

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF THURSTON, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1: As Water System Operator, Scott Oliver shall be paid \$1,080 bi-weekly; these payments shall be paid from the following funds:

a. Water Fund 100 %

SECTION 2: The performance of duties expected of this position may require irregular work hours and/or flexibility in the work schedule. Scott Oliver shall, as necessary, devote time outside normal working hours to the Village's business, and understands the work will be performed as required by Council.

SECTION 3: Scott Oliver is entitled to, and will receive, only the following benefits:

Scott Oliver shall be responsible for paying his portion of the Ohio Public Employees Retirement System (OPERS) and making all the appropriate contributions on the Employee's behalf per all applicable Ohio Revised Code sections. The Village of Thurston shall pay its portion of OPERS as required under Ohio law.

SECTION 4: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 5: All prior legislation, or any parts thereof, which is/are inconsistent with this Ordinance is/are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereto.

SECTION 6: For the reasons noted in the preamble, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, morals, and welfare of the citizens of Thurston, Ohio. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.




