Passed JANUARY 4, 2023

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING AT CERTAIN LOCATIONS ALONG HIGH STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF THURSTON, OHIO

WHEREAS, Council for the Village of Thurston has examined carefully the on-street and/or street right-of-way motor vehicle parking on High Street, and the Village's need to restrict such parking; and

WHEREAS, R.C. 715.22 grants the Village of Thurston the general power to regulate the use of the streets within the Village; and

WHEREAS, Council of the Village of Thurston, in order to provide safer streets, free movement, access of emergency vehicles, and better lines of sight, believes it is necessary to prohibit parking on High Street at and near the intersections Second Street and Third Street in the Village of Thurston.

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF THURSTON, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1: No person shall permit or cause the stopping, standing, or parking of a motor vehicle on the west side of High Street, within twenty-five feet (25') (north and south) of the intersection of Second Street, or within this right-of-way, in the Village of Thurston, Ohio, except as when necessary to avoid a conflict with other traffic or while obeying the lawful directions/orders of a police officer or a traffic control device.

SECTION 2: No person shall permit or cause the stopping, standing, or parking of a motor vehicle on the either side of High Street, within twenty-five feet (25') of the intersection of Third Street (north and south), or within this right-of-way, in the Village of Thurston, Ohio, except as when necessary to avoid a conflict with other traffic or while obeying the lawful directions/orders of a police officer or a traffic control device.

SECTION 3: Council for the Village of Thurston hereby authorizes the Village Administrator, or his designee, to purchase and install, or have installed, according to the Uniform Manual of Traffic Control Devices, "No Parking" signs at, near, and along High Street in accordance with the locations described in Sections 1 and 2.

SECTION 4: Whoever violates Section 1 is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

SECTION 5: Whoever violates Section 2 is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

SECTION 6: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that any and all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 7: All prior legislation, or any parts thereof, which is/are inconsistent with this Ordinance is/are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereto.

SECTION 8: This Ordinance shall become effective at the earliest time allowed by law.


