<u>Business from Fire Chief</u> – Chief Jim Hite was not present, but Asst.Chief Jamie Carroll was present. Council reviewed the report left by the Chief.

Business from the Safety Committee – None

<u>Business from the Service Committee</u> – None. Jimmy said the men's group from Thurston United Methodist Church wants to clean up the cemetery. Del Barr suggested to Jimmy that the Village should come up with rules for the cemetery in regards to trees, plants & shrubs and see if a Boy's Scout group can maintain the cemetery. Garry & David have spent a lot of time cleaning up the cemetery this year.

Jimmy made a motion to let the Thurston UMC's men's club clean up, pull shrubs, trees, and bushes and whatever needs done to clean it up. Garry second. Roll call vote: all YES. Motion carried.

Business from the Finance Committee – Didn't meet.

Business from the Regional Planning Representative – Robert said there was nothing that pertained to the Village.

<u>Old Business</u> – Aaron said there's been no response from the nuisance letter for the house at 2179 Third St. It was sent on August 14, 2013. Mary said we'd have to check out the property to see if anything has been done.

<u>New Business</u> – Mary said the Walnut Creek Sewer District would take \$500 each for 2 diesel generators that they are having replaced. They are wondering if we'd like to purchase. Jimmy is concerned that they are 3-phase and may not be compatible. We'll have to check with electricians. Jimmy made a motion to purchase the 2 generators from Walnut Creek Sewer District for \$500 each pending confirmation that they will work for our purposes. Robert second. Roll call vote: all YES. Motion carried.

Mary said the contractors will be drilling the water wells on October 14th or 15th.

Mary thanked Garry and David for the work they've done in the cemetery and the municipal building basement. The basement was flooded with 4-foot of water. We had to purchase and install a new sump pump to take care of the problem.

Lowell said the state paving contractors tarred over a few water shut-off boxes in the village. He said he and Garry would go around next week to fix the issue.

As there was no further business to discuss, JoAnn made a motion to adjourn. Jimmy second. Roll call vote: all YES. Motion carried. Time is 7:35 p.m.
